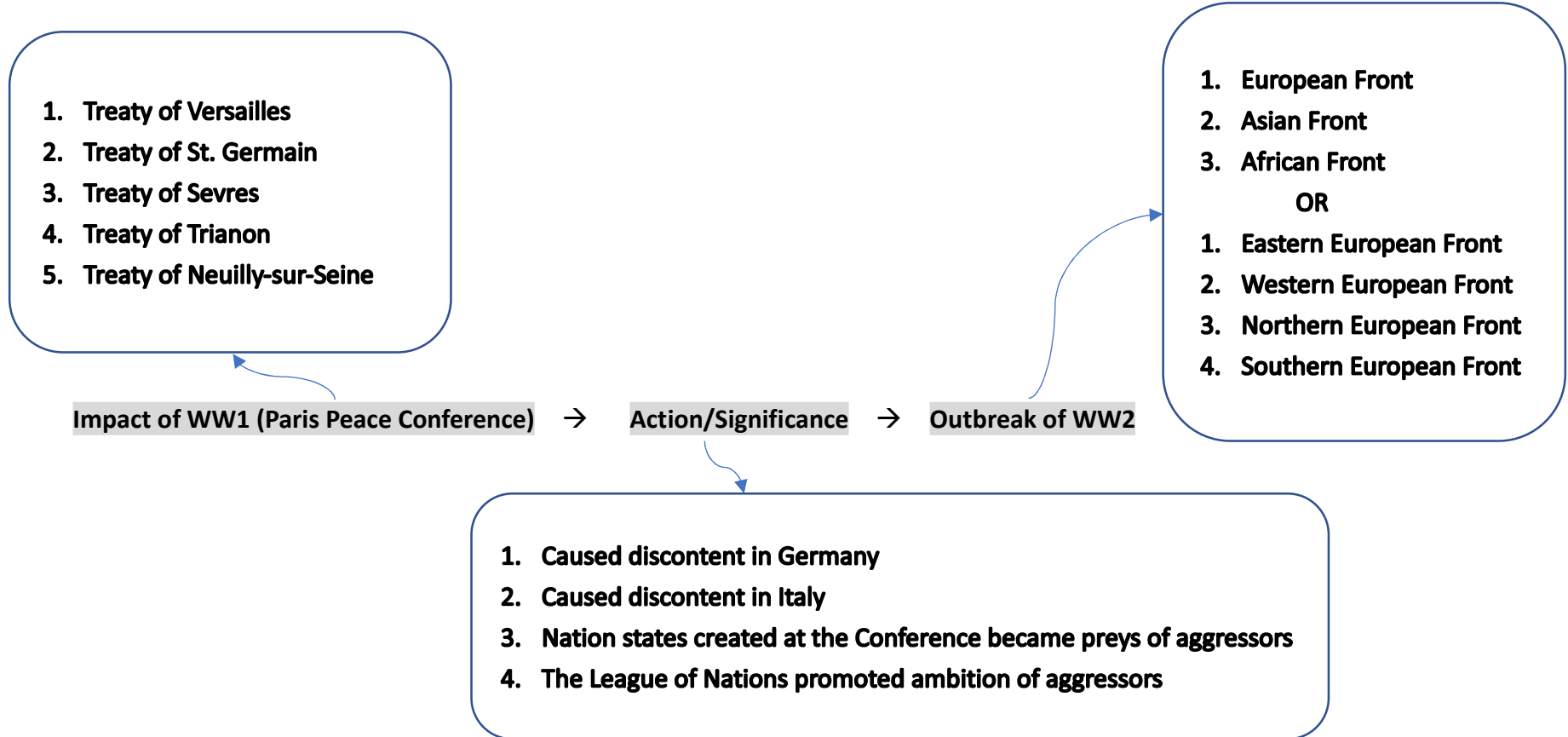

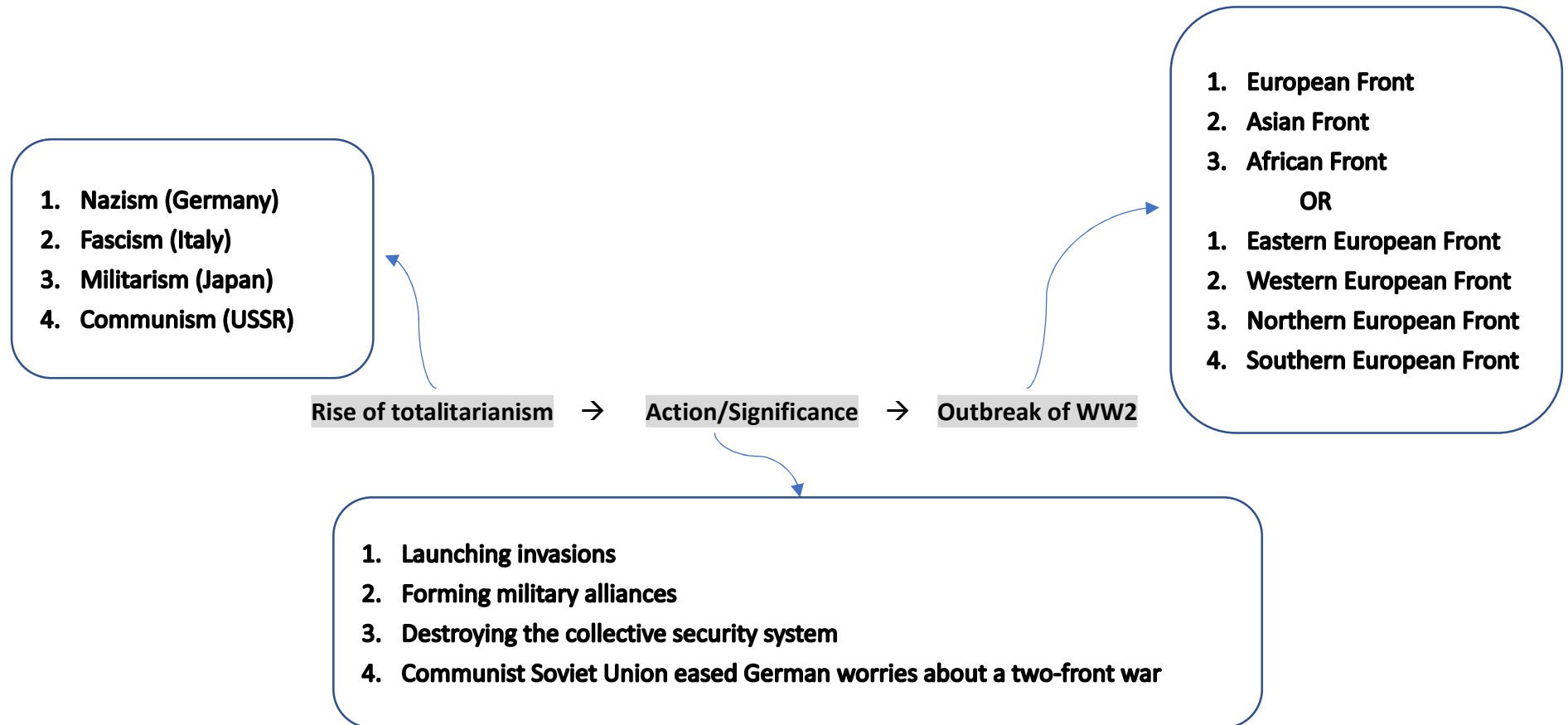
Using multiple examples

- ✧ 1935: Italian invasion of Abyssinia
- ✧ 1935: Germany broke the Treaty of Versailles and restarted conscription
- ✧ 1936: German remilitarization of the Rhineland
- ✧ 1937: Japan started a total war on China
- ✧ 1938: The Anschluss
- ✧ 1938: German annexation of the Sudetenland
- ✧ 1939: German annexation of Czechoslovakia
- ✧ 1939: Italian invasion of Albania
- ✧ 1939: German sudden attack on Poland that sparked the Second World War

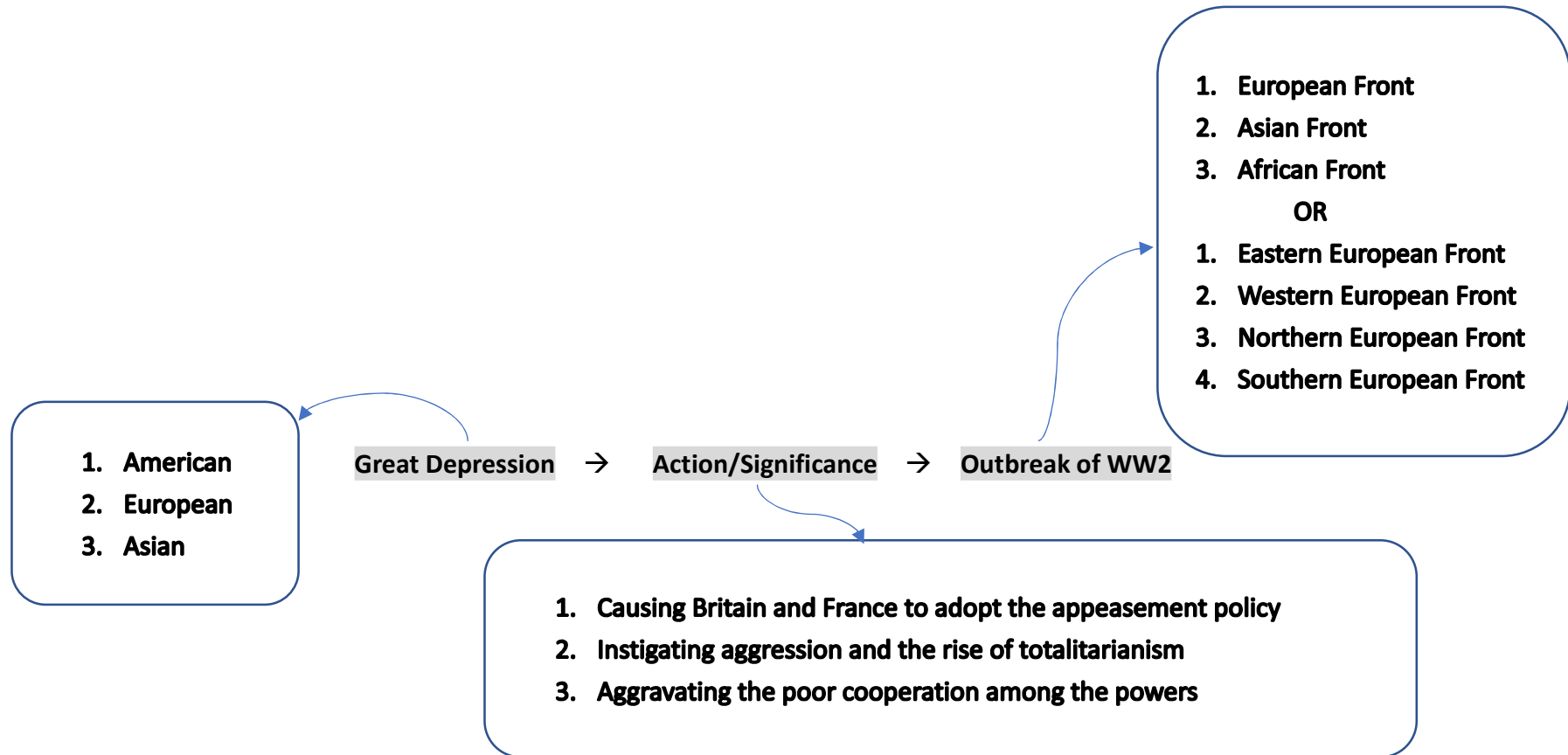
Importance of Impact of WW1 (Paris Peace Conference) to the Outbreak of WW2



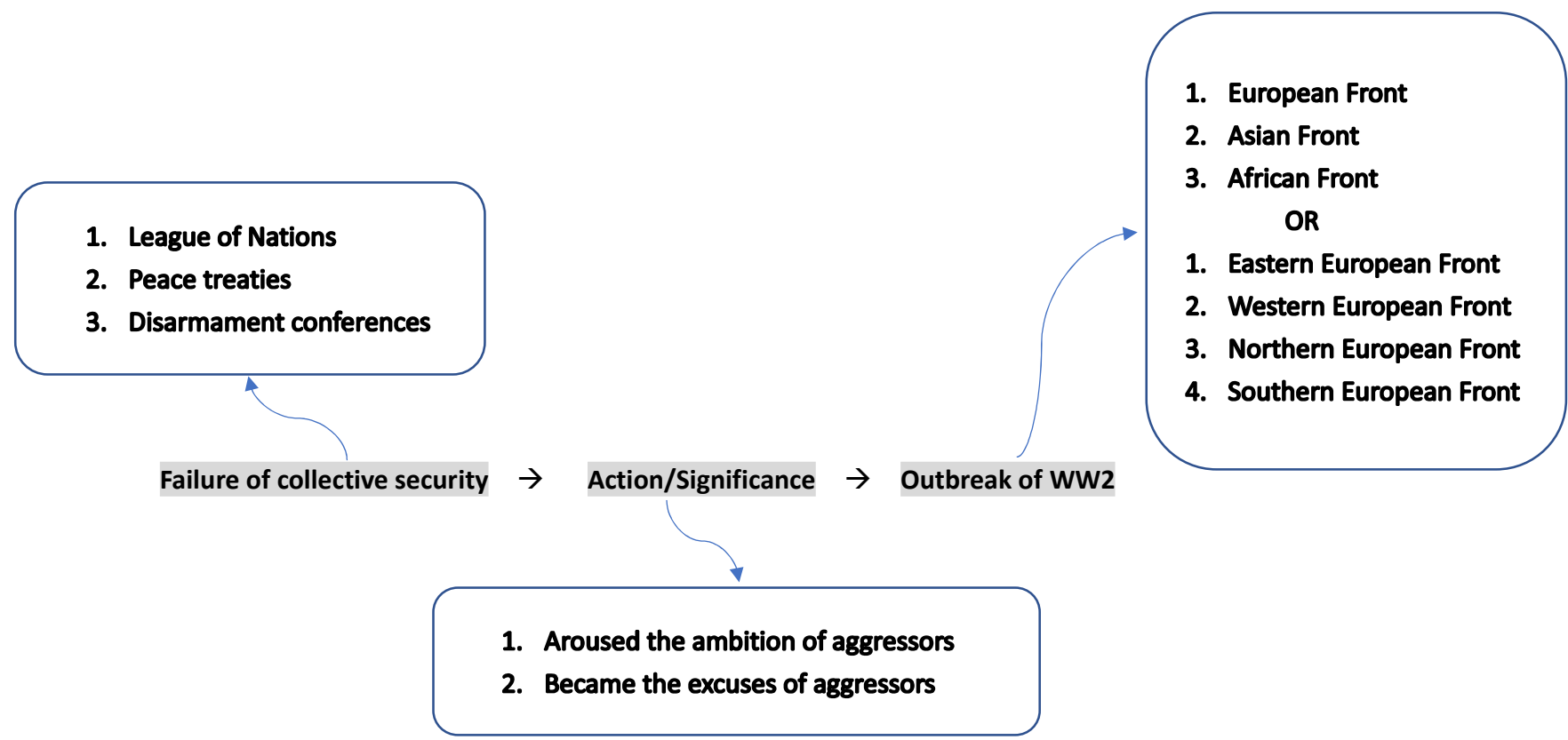
Importance of Rise of totalitarianism to the Outbreak of WW2



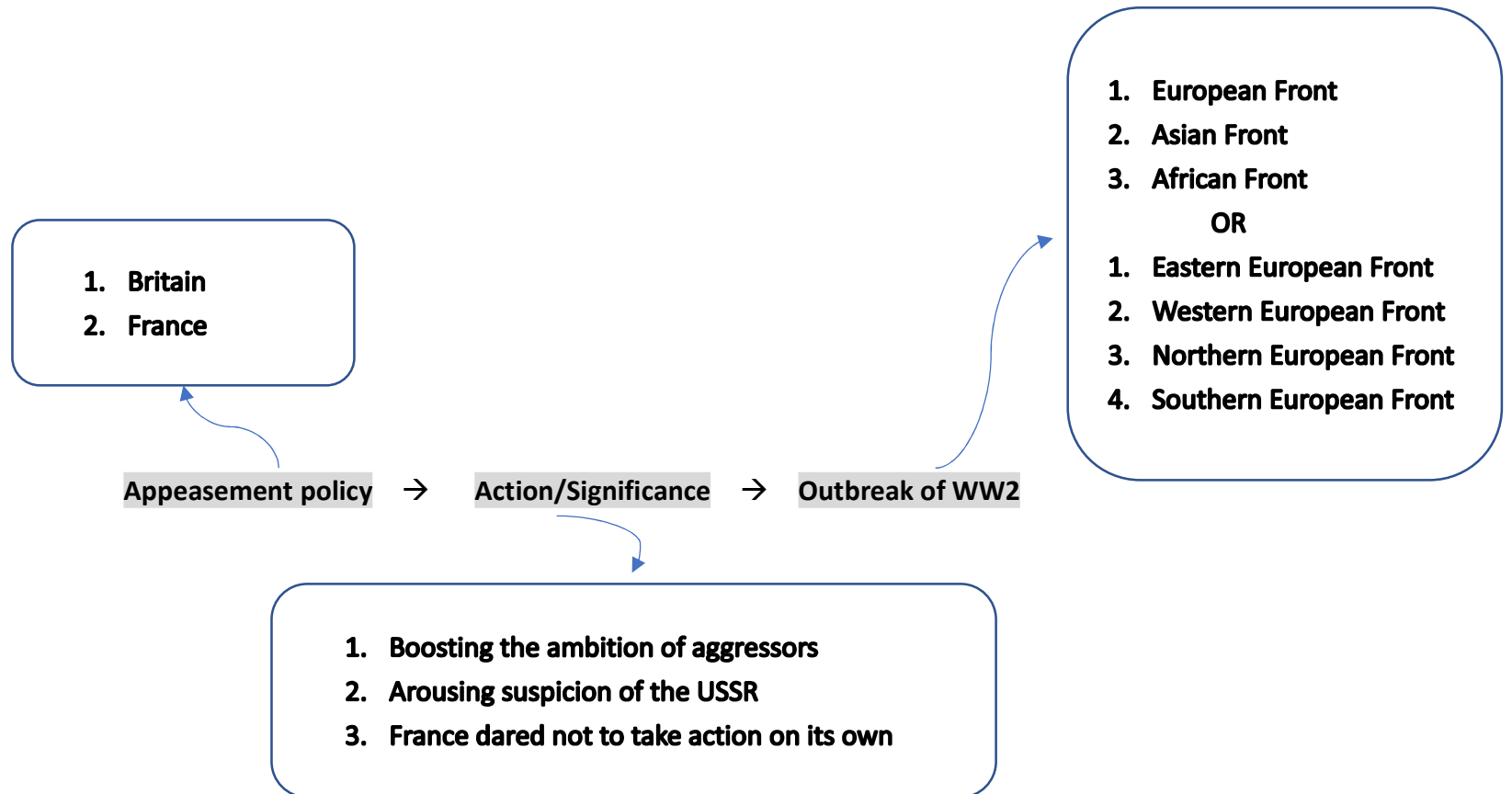
Importance of Great Depression to the Outbreak of WW2

Inadequate cooperation among the powers → Action/Significance → Outbreak of WW2

- 1. Became an excuse for the aggressors to expand
- 2. Eased German worries about a two-front war
